I. GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE DISCIPLINE

The goal of mastering the discipline (module) is:

To form students' civic identity based on an understanding of the historical experience of building Russian statehood at all its stages, and an understanding that throughout Russian history, a strong central authority has been of paramount importance for the construction and preservation of a unified cultural-historical space of national statehood.

This goal is achieved by students mastering the basic categories and concepts of historical science and studying historical patterns.

The study of the discipline (module) "History of Russia" is aimed at fulfilling the following tasks:

To form in students a holistic image of Russian history with an understanding of its specific problems, to synchronize the Russian historical process with the global one, and to develop skills in working with historical sources and scholarly literature;

To help students master knowledge of historical facts—dates, locations, participants, and outcomes of the most important events, as well as historical names and terms; to assimilate historical concepts and theories; to pay special attention to periods when Russia faced significant historical challenges or experienced crises, examining their causes, prerequisites, and ways of overcoming them; the historical experience of the Russian state's national and confessional policy at all stages of its existence (including periods of the Russian Empire and the Soviet Union) in achieving interethnic peace and harmony, and the mutual influence and interpenetration of cultures;

To develop in students the skills and abilities to extract information from historical sources and apply it to solve cognitive tasks; to use methods of historical description (narrative of events, processes, phenomena) and explanation (revealing causes and effects of events, identifying commonalities and differences, determining their nature, classification, etc.);

To form an understanding of assessments of historical events and phenomena, and skills in critical thinking (the ability to determine and justify one's attitude to historical and contemporary events and their participants);

To form in students an understanding of the historical path of Russian civilization as an integral part of the world historical process through the study of major cultural-historical epochs;

To form in students a holistic understanding of the main periods and trends in the development of the multinational Russian state from ancient times to the present;

To teach students to identify and analyze the most essential connections and features of historical phenomena and processes, to systematize and generalize historical sources, and

to integrate individual and often disparate facts and events into a coherent system of reliable knowledge.

II. PLACE OF THE DISCIPLINE IN THE STRUCTURE OF THE UNIVERSITY'S CORE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

2.1. The academic discipline "**History of Russia**" belongs to the mandatory part of the curriculum. For full-time students, it is studied in the 1st and 2nd semesters of the 1st year; for part-time students.

2.2. In mastering the course, students utilize knowledge acquired from studying subjects within the framework of secondary general education:

"History":

Knowledge of the place and role of historical science in the system of social sciences and humanities, an understanding of historiography;

The ability to evaluate different historical interpretations;

Skills in systematic historical analysis of Russia's place and role in world history.

"Social Studies":

Knowledge of society as an integral, evolving system in the unity and interaction of its main spheres and institutions; the main trends and possible prospects for the development of the world community in a globalized world;

The ability to identify cause-and-effect, functional, hierarchical, and other connections between social objects and processes; to apply knowledge acquired in everyday life, to predict the consequences of decisions made;

Skills in mastering the basic conceptual apparatus of the social sciences; evaluating social information, and the ability to search for information in sources of various types to reconstruct missing links for the purpose of explaining and evaluating diverse phenomena and processes of social development.

2.3. Mastering the discipline "History of Russia" lays the foundation for the further study of humanities disciplines within the Federal State Educational Standard of Higher Education ("Philosophy," "Political Science," "Sociology," "Culturology," etc.).

III. REQUIREMENTS FOR MASTERING THE DISCIPLINE

The process of mastering the discipline "History of Russia" is aimed at forming competency UK-5 in accordance with the Federal State Educational Standard of Higher

Education (FSEHE) and the Core Educational Program (CEP) for all undergraduate fields of study.

Methodological Guidelines for Organizing Students' Independent Work

In the course of studying the discipline "History of Russia," students' independent work (SW) is provided.

When studying Russian history, the organization of independent work represents a unity of three interrelated forms:

1. Classroom-based independent work, carried out under the direct guidance of an instructor.
2. Out-of-class independent work.
3. Creative work, including educational and research activities.

Methodological Recommendations for Organizing Classroom-Based Independent Work of Students

Independent Work of Students during Lectures

During lectures, students are offered questions for independent work with references to literature sources. During the lecture, advance assignments for independent study of fragments of future topics (in articles, textbooks, etc.) may be given.

Independent Work of Students during Practical (Seminar) Classes

The following methods are used to organize work during practical classes:

- * Comment on a statement – explain the idea contained in an excerpt, what position of its author it indicates.
- * Compare – identify similarities and differences in positions based on certain criteria.
- * Justify one of several proposed answer options – provide arguments in favor of the correctness of the chosen answer and indicate the errors in other options.
- * Argue (substantiate, prove, explain) an answer – means to justify (or refute) a particular point of view; to substantiate one's own position based on theoretical or practical generalizations, data, etc.
- * Conduct an analysis – break down the studied phenomena into component parts, compare them to identify the essential, necessary, and defining elements.
- * Outline an idea, concept, theory in theses– using material from textbooks and other literature, briefly, but without compromising content, formulate the main provisions of the doctrine.
- * Give a description, characterize phenomena – means to name the essential,

necessary features of a phenomenon (or a provision of a theory) and identify its distinctive features.

* Depict schematically – means to present the content of the answer in the form of a table, diagram, chart, or other graphic forms.

Methodological recommendations for organizing out-of-class independent work

Methodological Instructions for work with Lecture Notes

Lecture notes are one of the main sources of information for a specific course, in addition to recommended textbooks, teaching aids, scholarly works, analytical and statistical collections, etc.

Working with lecture notes allows not only for studying the material but also for gaining an understanding of the availability of various sources and comparing different views on the main problems of the course. Taking lecture notes helps students retain the main points of the lecture for a long time; promotes attentiveness; activates the student's thinking as they must select the key information and write it down.

Lecture notes should be concise, recording only the most essential information necessary for independent work. Refinement of lecture notes is carried out using textbooks, methodological, and additional literature. Furthermore, in accordance with the work programs, lectures are not provided for relatively simple topics; they are offered for independent study. In this case, the student selects, studies, analyzes, and summarizes the recommended literature.

It is advisable to work with lecture notes immediately after listening to the lecture.

Methodological Instructions for Students' Independent Work with Literature

Students are recommended not to limit themselves to lecture notes when studying the discipline "History of Russia." Independent work with books is a necessary condition for successful study.

Creative comprehension, critical analysis of facts, phenomena, processes, and acquiring knowledge from various sources contribute to the historical formation of thinking and one's own worldview.

Evaluation materials for current control

According to the Regulation "On the Point-Rating System for Assessing Student Performance at Irkutsk State University," the mastery of each discipline studied in a semester is evaluated with a maximum of 100 points. This maximum number of points (S_{total}), which a student can earn per semester for each discipline, consists of the sum of points for current work during the semester ($S_{current}$) and points obtained during the examination session ($S_{session}$).

Herein, the maximum number of points for current work during the semester ($S_{current}$) is limited to 60 points, while a maximum of 30 points is allocated for the final assessment (exam or graded pass/fail test, $S_{session}$).

Based on the results of work during the semester, bonus points (from 0 to 10) may be awarded. The basis for receiving these is attendance and the mandatory successful completion of main types of learning activities (at least 50% of the maximum possible points for these activities).

Assessment Materials for Intermediate Certification (Pass/Fail Test / Graded Pass/Fail Test)

Intermediate certification in the discipline is provided in the form of a pass/fail test or a graded pass/fail test – an oral interview based on questions from a ticket.

In accordance with the Regulation "On the Point-Rating System for Assessing Student Performance at Irkutsk State University," a student who has earned less than 40 points as a result of current work in the discipline ($S_{current}$ is not admitted to take the test and is assigned 0 session points ($S_{session} = 0$)).

A student who has earned 40 or more points during the semester ($S_{current}$) is admitted to take the discipline's test, where they can earn up to 30 points ($S_{session}$).

In case the total sum of points is less than 60 but more than 40 points, the student may continue taking the test orally (no more than 3 questions, maximum score for each is 10 points).

The test is conducted in the form of an oral interview based on questions from a ticket, which includes 3 questions on the materials studied during the corresponding semester.

If a student scores less than 10 points on the test, the test is considered “failed”.

If a student scores 10 or more points on the test, they are added to the sum of points for current work, which are recorded in the student's record book.

Grading Criteria

9-10 points

The student:

- * Gave a comprehensive answer to the ticket question in literate literary language;
- * Showed precise knowledge of chronology, conceptual apparatus, and the role of prominent figures in a given historical period;
- * Demonstrated the ability to analyze historical sources and identify cause-and-effect relationships within the context of the era;
- * Freely used knowledge of debatable historical issues and argued their point of view convincingly;
- * Answered additional questions comprehensively and correctly.

7-8 points

The student:

- * Correctly conveys the main content of the question;
- * Shows knowledge of historical sources, alternative viewpoints, and names of major historical figures;
- * Is oriented in chronology and terminology;
- * Demonstrates skills in analyzing cause-and-effect relationships within the context of the era;
- * Correctly answers additional questions;
- * Makes minor errors.

5-6 points

The student:

- * Partially reveals the main material of the ticket question;
- * Has a general understanding of historical sources, chronology, and historical figures;
- * Attempts to identify cause-and-effect relationships;
- * Makes errors when answering main and additional questions.

3-4 points

The student:

- * Is able to cover no more than one-third of the question;
- * Demonstrates extremely fragmentary knowledge of chronology, conceptual apparatus, and the role of prominent figures in a given historical period;
- * Cannot analyze historical sources or identify cause-and-effect relationships within the context of the era;
- * Lacks knowledge of debatable historical issues and is unable to argue a stated position;

- * Makes serious errors when answering additional questions.

1-2 points

The student demonstrates:

- * A lack of any stable understanding or knowledge of major historical events, dates, and figures;
- * Inability to connect facts with the era or characterize them;
- * Absence of correct answers to additional questions;
- * Lack of command of the necessary conceptual apparatus;
- * Inability to answer additional questions.

0 points

- * Refusal to answer
- * Inability to answer any question, including additional ones
- * Use of cheat sheets during the test
